- work with partners to influence longer-term planning, ensuring ASC needs are embedded within national policy, strategy and delivery

- Investment across the system/place
- Shared information and data
- Governance and security
- Public understanding
- Skills and confidence
- Building on what works already

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Local government the key partner for place level

- Councils provide more than 800 services to residents
- Statutory duty to provide public health and social care for adults and children
- Commissioners of adult social care and key relationships with care providers
- Wealth of information about local areas and communities covering all wider determinants of health
- Cover housing, planning, licensing, community safety, schools, leisure, transport
- Existing place leaders
- Councillors are democratically elected and accountable to local communities





Risks and opportunities
